CHICAGO, Nov. 29.—With both sides confident of victory, the foot ball teams of the University of Chicago and the University of Michigan will meet on Marshall field tomorrow in what is believed will be the greatest foot ball game ever contested in the middle west. This year, for the first time in several seasons, the winning team tomorrow will have a clear title to the foot ball championship of the "Big Nine."

Chicago One Man Short. Michigan will go into tomorrow's battle with its full strength, Shulte, the left guard, being in the game despite the report that he would be protested by Chicago.

Michigan Team Heavier. Michigan is the heavier team of the two, its total weight being 2,000 pounds. Chicago's total weight is 2,048 pounds.

Coach Yost and his squad, numbering twenty-four players, reached Chicago this afternoon, confident of a victory tomorrow.
