FIRST TRIP OF NEW TRAIN

Initial Run of Chicago-Los Angeles Limited Begun Auspiciously.

NEWSPAPER MEN AS SPECIAL GUESTS

Twenty-Seven from Various Cities, East and West, on This Flying Palace on Wheels.

Five minutes ahead of time the spiendid new Chicago-Los Angeles Limited, which is to run daily over the Northwestern, the Union Pacific and new San Pedro route, rolled into the Union station Monday morning after a most enjoyable ride from Chi-

The magnificent equipment of this train is the newest and most complete product of the Pullman shops. The train is electric fighted throughout with the most complete electric system. It consisted of seven cars, including Pullman drawing room and tourist sleeping cars, free reclining chair cars. composite observation cars with buffet smoking room and dining cars.

This train will add much to the fine service on the Northwestern between Omalia and Chicago, making good connections at each end of the run, and will leave Omaha for the east at 11 p. m. daily. As t pulled into the Union station on this its initial trip it carried a very distinguished party of railroad officials and newspaper men, besides some regular travelers, including Senator Reed Smoot of Utah, who was going to Salt Lake City to spend Christman.

For the inspection of the party at the Omaha station, Superintendent McKeen, jr., had motor car No. 1 with its trailer, which soon will be put into service.

I. C. Ferguson, assistant general passenger agent of the Northwestern, and C. G. Hall, advertising agent of the Northwestern, accompanied the party to Omaha. E. L. Lomax, general passenger and ticket agent, and Alfred Darlow, advertising agent, of the Union Pacific, accompanied the party on west, looking after its welfare from Omaha to Los Angeles. Mr. Darlow. in fact, came out from Chicago, having gone over there Saturday night. The contingent of newspaper men was the same as printed in The Bee Sunday.

"Dick" Little in the Crowd. Towering above any other member of the party was R. H. Little, special war correspondent, with his seven feet of height who has seen service in Cuba and the Philippines and who tried to do some work in the late Russo-Jap war, but was ordered out of the country. Little was most enthusiastic over the trip and said he had never seen anything like it in his life.

"Why you press the button and you think you want something and it comes," said Little. "I have traveled all over this terrestrial globe, but I never saw anything like this. Come over here and see this diner. Now, wouldn't that make a man want to leave home? Look at the American Beauts. You can't eat them, but there's plenty to eat. Did you see that observation compartment car at the rear. Nothing like it anywhere. Beats the Overland Limited." The train pulled out on time, 11:30, bearing its load of human freight on a schedule

of sixty-eight hours for its trip from Chicago, better than forty-four miles an hour. Dwight Swobe joined the party at Omaha. and his father. Captain Swobe, renewed acquaintance with Mr. Little, whom he had known in the Philippines. Eugene Duvall. essistant general agent of the Milwaukee, and T. R. Porter, special correspondent for several eastern papers also joined the

Visitors Like Nebrasks.
GRAND ISLAND, Neb., Dec. 18.—The Los Angeles Limited, the new train from Chicago to southern California, reached here on time to the minute and is filled with passengers already. The run has been most successful, crowds of citizens of every town passed being at the stations to see the new train whiz, by. The observation car is crowded with sightseers. The Union Pacific has outdone itself in preparations for the initial run. A poll of passengers aboard showed twenty-six states represented, many of the passengers having waited a week and more in order to be on the initial run. The eastern newspaper men aboard are enjoying the finest trip of their lives and are pleasantly disappointed at seeing country the equal in civilization of the oldest sections of the road instead of frontier settlements, as some expected.
