Hofeldt, the board gave to Chairman Kennard a rising vote of thanks for his courteous and impartial service as presiding officer, and the same was spread upon the minutes.

and some bills approved and ordered paid. Commissioners McDonald and Hofeldt, whose regular term expired with the adjournment of the board, will not attempt to hold the seats pending a decision of the supreme court on the question raised by Commissioner Newton of Lancaster county on the bill extending the term of commissloners for one year. Both men have filed bonds in due form so as to preserve any rights they may gain under the decision to be made later by the supreme court. Mr. McDonald, speaking for himself and Mr. Hofeldt, said:

"We do not wish to appear in the light of obstructionists or as wanting to hold our seats unlawfully, making the new commissioners fight for possession. We consider it our duty to take the action we have in filing bonds, so that if we have any rights in the premises they will be preserved."

Commissioner Hofeldt will retire to his farm at Elkhorn after nine years of service on the board. Commissioner McDonald will for the present occupy a position in the office of his brother, Sheriff McDonald. The new heard will organize on Tuesday. January 9, by the election of a new chairman. As yet there is no announced opposition to Chairman Kennard, who has served only one year.

Five Republican Members. "With the taking of office by Emmet G. Solomon and William G. Ure as county commissioners Thursday the board will be solidly republican for the first time in a long series of years; since 1871 in fact, except that in 1835 the board became republican by the appointment of A. L. Sutton, now district judge, to fill the unexpired term of Commissioner Paddock, who died. The Board of County Commissioners in 1871 consisted of Henry Eicke, E. H. Sherwood and W. A. Purchase. Then the board was divided politically again, J. H. Mc-Ardle and B. P. Knight succeeding Elcke and Sherwood. McArdle served on the board fifteen years in all, being a commissioner from 1857 to 1868, inclusive; then missing three years, then coming back and remaining a member until 1876, when his name drops out for good. After 1871 the board was composed of republicans and lemocrats.

Dick O'Keeffee became a member of the board for the first time in 1882. He served continuously until 1892, when he dropped out for ten years, coming back in 1902 and serving until a year ago. Peter Hofeldt first appeared as a member of the board in 1897 and has since been a member. He is now succeeded by Emmet G. Solomon. B. P. Knight was another commissioner who stuck through a long series of years.
