

PROBLEM OVER POLICE CASES

BOARD WILL NOT TAKE HAND

Police Commissioners Intend Giving No Aid to Thomas to Close Saloons.

"Most emphatically the fire and police board does not propose to take a hand in the Sunday closing of saloons."

W. J. Brouth, acting chairman of the board, so stated Monday morning. Another member, who did not wish his name used, said the same thing, and only one of the four is quoted as having any inclination whatever to make official the efforts put under way by Elmer E. Thomas and the Civic Federation.

The controlling powers of the commission stand on the ground that the body has nothing whatever to do with the direct enforcement of the laws and that this authority is vested exclusively in the mayor.

CLERGY COMMENDS THOMAS

Ministerial Association Votes to Help Civic Federation to Enforce Siccumb Law.

In a busy session Monday morning the Omaha Ministerial Association passed resolutions commending the Civic Federation, listened to a plea on behalf of the Young Women's Christian association, heard the report of the committee on the plans for a united evangelistic movement.

Resolutions were passed pledging the moral and material support of the ministers to the Civic Federation in its efforts to compel the saloons to abide by the provisions of the Siccumb law.

George G. Wallace, chairman of the executive committee of the Nebraska State Sunday School association, presented a plan for a union Sunday school educational campaign, to begin preferably February 5.

The committee on evangelistic movement reported that it had conferred with men in Seattle, Portland, Los Angeles, Denver and Minneapolis, where united revivals had been held, and found good results had been obtained in all these cities.

Rev. H. J. Kirchsteln read a paper on "The Social Nature in the Light of Present Social Conditions."
