Financial Management and Physical Operation Objects of General Amusement. ROAD ENJOYS UNBOUNDED PROSPERITY

Gross Earnings for 1905 Over Four Million Dollars Greater Than in 1904, or Over Seven Per Cent.

The financial management and physical operation of the Union Pacific railroad continue to be matters of wonder in the railroad and financial world.

Not only were last year's receipts the largest in the history of the physical operation of the Union Pacific, but the improvement of the increased traffic cost less than the expenditure for a smaller volume of business in 1904.

Average miles operated... 1905, 5,332; 1904, 5,232. Gross earnings... 1905, \$58,279,231; 1904, \$55,279,231.

At the close of the Union Pacific owned \$28,000,000 capital stock of its auxiliary companies and \$18,000,000 capital stock of other companies.
