MOORS PLAY WAITING PART

Mohammed El Torres to Take No Hand in Early Conference. WILL AWAIT AGREEMENT OF POWERS

ALGERIAS, Spain, Jan. 17.—The delegates of the Moroccan conference today took a day of letters to enable the secretaries to get ready for their work, and indulged in private conversations among themselves or spent the time in preparing with their junior colleagues for the discussion of the surveillance of contraband arms in Morocco.

Position of Morocco. Budget Making, an eminent authority on Morocco, in a private conference today in Arabic with Mohammed El Torres and repeated to the Associated Press the Moorish view, as follows: Mohammed El Torres will be a passive observer at the conference until it enters the last stage.

Would Bar Arms. Mohammed El Torres expresses satisfaction at the fact that the conference will begin with a discussion of contraband arms, as this is a question on which Morocco is anxious to secure international cooperation.
