**WEBSTER AND MUNGER HALT**

Two Framers of Constitution Pause at Interpreting Mooted Political Section.

TOO COMPLEX FOR AN OFF-HAND OPINION

Not Certain Whether State Executive Officer is Forbidden from Seeking Another Office While Holding One.

None of the officers of the executive department shall be eligible to any other state office during the period for which they shall have been elected.

This section of the state constitution, which is being discussed just now in connection with the candidates for governor of Lieutenant Governor McMillon and State Treasurer Mortensen, is not being decided in a moment by some of the prominent lawyers of the state. John L. Webster and Judge W. H. Munger, two of the framers of the organic law, have halted at giving their interpretation of it.

Early in the forenoon Mr. Webster was asked for an opinion about the question. He said he would consider the matter, but at noon, after an hour's study, had not been able to formulate an opinion. Lieutenant Governor McMillon, who is a candidate for governor, conferred with Mr. Webster for half an hour regarding the point. Mr. Webster said the question was one not at all easy of solution and admits of much argument from both sides. It was too complex, he stated, to venture an offhand opinion upon it. He intends to go into it further and endeavor to reach a satisfactory conclusion.

"I have not given the matter any particular attention and am not prepared to make any statement or offer an opinion in which I would care to be quoted, in reference thereto," said Judge Munger. "It does appear to me, however, at first glance, that the constitutional provision is sufficient to govern the case, which provides that no executive officer shall be eligible to any other office during the period for which he is elected. Hence, I do not see how they can get around it. I do not think that a resignation would be sufficient, as the official being elected for a specific term, means the whole term. However, it is a matter that can only be determined by recourse to the supreme court."
