DUN'S REVIEW OF TRADE

Weather Conditions Stimulate Movements of Seasonable Merchandise.

OUTLOOK FOR SPRING BUSINESS GOOD

Manufacturers in Most Lines Are Falling Further Behind with Deliveries.

NEW YORK, Feb. 16.—R. G. Dun & Co.'s Weekly Review of Trade tomorrow will say:

Weather conditions have continued to stimulate retail trade in seasonable merchandise, part of the earlier unsatisfactory results being made up by vigorous demands for winter clothing and footwear, while household consumption of fuel has revived retail trade, so that coal dealers will not carry over as heavy stocks at the end of the season as was indicated by last month's business. There is the possibility of a strike unsettling confidence in the future, joining and wholesale sale of dry goods for the spring trade instances. Manufacturers in most leading industries are falling further behind with deliveries, particularly in steel business, while increased capacity has not kept pace with requirements. As to foreign trade, preliminary statistics of exports in January fell short of the month preceding, but the corresponding month in previous years, while for the last week of this month exports were \$2,112,256 larger than last year, but imports declined \$1,741,880. Railway earnings in the United States, again, are 25 per cent. larger than in the same week of 1905, but prices of securities were somewhat irregularly affected by the money market and heavy new bond issues.

BRADSTREET'S REVIEW OF TRADE

Spring Business in Nearly All Lines Continues to Expand.

NEW YORK, Feb. 16.—Bradstreet's tomorrow will say:

Spring trade in dry goods, clothing, shoes and millinery continues to show expansion despite the presence of winter conditions. Retail trade in these lines is not less than anticipated and shipments of goods on order orders are being brought on unchecked. Retail trade was helped by quick delivery of goods, and the fact that unsatisfactory business has been brought on by the fact that the winter season has been generally favorable. Domestic hides continue dull and weak. Leading western live stock prices have brought on some new business west and south. Leading interests are reported with practically full books, but deliveries in some lines are free and high premiums are said to be disappearing, except where special stock building material was apparently quick to take in the north. Building material and the output in northern forests has been helped by recent heavy snows. Prices of lumber are still firm, but are still firm in the west on March 1, but are still firm in the east. Coal feels the influence of cold weather, but in the north, where there is an urgent demand, some of which is for coal stored pending a clearer view of the outlook of the present season. Bank clearings are much smaller, reflecting decreased stock speculation and the fact that banks are in a condition which looks critical in view of the present state of the money market. Clearings are fair to good, except in the south, where holding of cotton is a drawback. Prices of cotton are still firm, and the future crop development will largely govern fall and winter trade, which as yet is of a small aggregate volume. Wheat, including flour, exports from the United States and Canada for the week ending February 15, 1906, 2,931,642 bushels, against 2,241,000 bushels last week, 355,840 bushels this time last year, 1,730,000 bushels in 1904 and 2,713,732 bushels in 1903. From July 1 to date the exports are 59,516,025 bushels, against 41,833 bushels last year, 104,752,109 bushels in 1904 and 156,277,776 bushels in 1903. Business failures in the United States for the week ending February 15 number 204, against 241 last week, 241 in the week of 1905, 231 in 1904 and 228 in 1903. In Canada failures for the week number 192, against 207 last week and 17 in this week a year ago.
