

DUN'S REVIEW OF TRADE

Weather Conditions Stimulate Movements of Seasonable Merchandise.

OUTLOOK FOR SPRING BUSINESS GOOD Most in Are Falling Further Be-

hind with Deliveries.

NEW YORK, Feb. 16 -- R. G. Dun & Co.'s Weekly Review of Trade tomorrow will

Weather conditions have continued to stimulate retail trade in seasonable merchondise, part of the earlier unsatisfactory results being offset by a vigorous demand for winter clothing and footwear, while household consumption of fuel has revived retail trade, so that coal dealers will not carry over as heavy stocks at the end of the season as was indicated by last month's business. Nor has the possibility of a strike unsettled confidence in the future, jobbing and wholesale sales of dry goods for the spring trade reaching a greater asgregate than last year and collections are prompt in most instances. Manufacturers in most leading industries are falling further behind with deliveries, particularly in the steel business, while increased capacity has not kept pace with requirements, but reports from the woolen mills are irregular. As to foreign trade preliminary statistics of exports in January fell short of the month preceding, but promise to surpass records for the corresponding month in previous years, while for the last week at this port exports were \$2,911.3% larger than a year ago, but imports declined \$1.741.889. Railway earnings in the first week of February were 24.5 per cent larger than in the same week of 1995, but prices of securities were somewhat irregular because of the firmer money market and heavy new bond issues.

Failures this week numbered 241 in the United States, against 258 last year, and 33 in Canada, compared with 32 a year ago.

BRADSTREET'S REVIEW OF TRADE

Spring Business in Nearly All Lines Continues to Expand.

NEW YORK, Feb. 16.-Bradstreets tomor Spring trade in dry goods, clothing, shoes and millinery continues to show expansion despite the presence of winter conditions. Interruption from this source, in fact, has been less than anticipated and shipments of goods on old orders and preparations for wholesale trade at leading centers go on unchecked. Retail trade was helped by the weather, but considerable stocks will unquestionably be carried over because recorder business has been heavy. The effect of this carry-over on next fall and winter demands remains to be seen. Other developments have been generally favorable, Concession in pig iron prices have brought out some new business west and south, Leading interests are reported with practically full books, but deliveries in some lines are freer and high premiums are said to be disappearing, except where small, quick-delivery orders can be filled from stock. Building material was apparently never so active as at this season, lumber leading, and the output in northern forests has been belped by recent heavy snows. Prices on common brick will be reduced at the west on March 1, but are still firm at the east. Coal feels the influence of cold weather and strike talk in firmer prices and enlarged demand, some of which is for coal to be stored pending a clearer view of the outcome of the present resolutions.
