OUTBREAK IN CHINA EXPECTED TO GROW

If Action is Taken Troops Must Be Sent from United States, as Islands Need All They Have.

SAN FRANCISCO, Feb. 28.—"Things are beginning to look serious in the far east," said General Funston in an interview yesterday, "and the situation of the War Department in the Philippines will, in my opinion, be justified before the end of the present uprising. Through the dispatches thus far received seem to indicate that the outbreaks have been confined to English residents in China, it is unnecessary to suppose that the insurrectionary mobs which have hitherto wrought such havoc among foreigners will make any distinction of nationality if they ever start a massacre."

China Will Make Amends. PEKING, Feb. 28.—The government has instructed the governor of Nanchang province of Kiangsi where the trouble broke out, six French Jesuit missionaries and four British subjects were killed, to punish severely all participants in the massacre, and declares its willingness to make, without question, any reasonable reparation demanded. Many foreigners at Peking know the governor of Nanchang and consider him efficient and friendly. They believe his version of the trouble and credit his statement that he was unable to prevent the disturbance. American, British and German gunboats are proceeding to the nearest possible point to Nanchang.

ALLEN PLEADS SELF-DEFENSE

Negro Charged with Murder Says He Was Attacked with Knife.

STORY OPPOSITE FROM THAT OF WOMAN

Defendant Makes Out That Dead Man Was Aggressive, and He Simply Defended His Own Life.

Leslie Allen, the defendant in the murder case before Judge Sutton, went on the stand Wednesday afternoon and gave his version of the shooting affair in which Lee Jarrett was killed. Allen's story differed in almost every essential detail from that told by Mary Jarrett, the only other eye witness.

Allen said on the evening of the shooting he went home and had trouble with Jarrett and the latter struck at him with a drawn knife, knocked him down and trampled upon him, and then threatened to kill him. Just before this happened he said his brother locked the back door and Jarrett went out. Allen says he unlocked the door and ran, Jarrett chasing him about three blocks. He came up town, bought the revolver and went back home to get his things. Jarrett was not there when he arrived. He came in two or three minutes later and attacked him with the knife, with the mark of a slash on his forehead.

During his testimony the scuffle in which Jarrett was killed was reproduced in pantomime by the defendant and his attorney, Mr. Macfarland. Mr. Macfarland took the knife and acted the part of Jarrett, while Allen held the gun and went through the movements as he said they happened on the night of the shooting. Allen also positively denied he had gone through a mock marriage ceremony with Miss Jarrett and said they had gone to living together under an agreement to live as man and wife until death.
