TAKING UP DITCH PROBLEM

Council Committee and City Engineer to Hold Meeting Sunday.

HOPE TO COMMENCE WORK AT EARLY DAY

Idea is to Have the Troublesome Stream Deepened and Bridges Raised Before the Heavy Rains in June.

Councilman Maloney, chairman of the council, committee appointed to take charge of the work of deepening and widening Indian creek from Sixteenth street to Eighth street, has called a meeting of the committee for Sunday afternoon at the office of City Engineer Elyre.

The chief obstacle in dredging Indian creek between the points named is the number of bridges which will be encountered. There are forty-three bridges spanning the creek between Sixteenth street and Eighth street, of which twenty-six are owned by the railroad companies.
