Trade Rules Steady Throughout the Week Session.

SNOW BLANKETS WESTERN WHEAT

Firmer Feeling in Corn and Buying on Dry Weather in Argentina - Oats Steady and Close Unchanged.

OMAHA, March 2, 1906.

The wheat market was a trifle easier at the close, after a steady session throughout the week. Trade was light. Productions of a cold wave following a rain in the northwestern wheat belt caused some apprehension, and the market was buying on a decline to cover. Later a telegram from Nileslet at Kansas City allayed this fear by the report of snow in western Kansas. The cash market showed some signs of improvement.

A little firmer feeling in corn developed. Receipts were not large and there was a better cash demand, though fluctuations were small. There is some buying on dry weather in Argentina. The trade expects a scanty market.

Oats unchanged. Demand for closed unchanged. Domestic and export demand was fair. Chicago market, 25.00 bushels; wheat, 25.00; corn, 25.00; oats, 25.00.

OMAHA GRAIN AND PROVISIONS

Features of the Trading and Closing Prices on Board of Trade.

CHICAGO, March 2.—Rain and snow throughout the day. The market for wheat in the United States had a weakening effect today on the local wheat market. At the close wheat for export was quoted at 80c, 10c over of 8c. Oats were unchanged. Provisions were a shade to the higher.

During the week there has been a general decline in the wheat price favored higher prices, there being a fairly active demand by commission houses and stores. Receipts for March 1, Liverpool, notwithstanding the sharp decline here yesterday and the official report of a cold wave throughout portions of the west and southwest, also encouraged the bulls. Later, however, effect of the cold wave prediction was offset by numerous reports of a heavy fall of snow or rain in various portions of the north and west. The session advanced trade became dull, with prices moving slightly in either direction.

MINNEAPOLIS, March 2.—WHEAT.—First quality, 80c; second quality, 78c; 40c; first clear, 80c; second clear, 78c.

Provisions opened weak because of a decline in the price of live hogs. A decrease of live contracts was noted for the remainder of the session. A firm bid was received from a large trader, but the volume of business was small and trading was largely confined to the local market.
