

RECORD IN BANK CLEARINGS

Two Millions Six Hundred Thousand Dollars in One Day for Omaha.

SETTLEMENTS ON FARM TRANSACTION

Every Day in Year Omaha Surpasses Other Cities in Clearings, Far Greater in Point of Population.

Bank clearings in Omaha Monday reached the highest mark in the history of the local clearing house, the sum being \$2,626,245.58, which was nearly \$400,000 more than ever before.

Asked as to the probable cause of such large clearances, Luther Drake, president of the Merchants' National bank, said March 1 was clearance time on farms across throughout the state.

"March 1 is becoming to be recognized as a great day of settlement on sales and leases of farm lands in Nebraska and the result is a great interchange of credits.

March 1 has almost come to be called the annual settlement day for farm lands. On that day old leases are renewed and new leases made.

But as these and other bankers pointed out, this enormous gain in clearings is not spasmodic, but the ultimate outcome of a steady and constant increase in the volume of business transacted in Omaha and in consequence with the swelling tide of Omaha's general commercial supremacy over any single city of its size in the United States.
