ARMY MATTERS IN SENATE

Mr. Hale Charges General Staff with Desire to Invade China.

INDIAN BILL IS SENT TO CONFERENCE

Mr. Long Makes an Extended Speech in Favor of Statehood Bill as It Came from House.

WASHINGTON, March 6.—The question of the enlargement of the medical department of the army occupied the major portion of the time of the senate today.

The bill providing for the displacement of contract surgeons by physicians who shall be given the rank of army officers, and the reorganization of the medical corps, Mr. Hale criticized the bill as an entering wedge for a general increase of the army and said that it was a part of a general plan of the general staff which he charged with a general purpose of enhancing the army's importance.

Senate Routine.
