ROSTER OF BIG FAMILIES

South Omaha Rated High in the Record of Step-Ladder Groups.

When a father and mother can sit down to dinner with twenty-four children to care for and wait on it is no small matter. Butcher and grocer bills in that family are vast, and the laundry question and the various other "incidental" matters keep the "old folks" guessing.

Mr. and Mrs. George Elliott of Mechanicsville, N. Y., are the proud and happy parents of two dozen youngsters. To be sure, some of them are wage earners and therefore self-supporting, but so far as is known Mr. Elliott is the champion American father. Mrs. Elliott is as proud of her "babies" as is the papa, and the Elliott family is reckoned to be one of the healthiest and happiest as well as one of the biggest on record.

Ever since President Roosevelt stirred the fathers and mothers of America by his declaration against the perils of "race suicide" there has come about a decided change in the sentiment with regard to children. In some circles, where babies played second fiddle to blooded pups, the pups have been forced into the background and the babies are enthroned. At the first Mr. Roosevelt was smiled at, but as the force of his remarks came home to the Americans it dawned on them that their vigorous young president was right. Children always have been the delight of Mr. Roosevelt. Not long ago he caused a stir during his western trip by discovering Mr. and Mrs. Bartley P. Oliver and eight young children. Oliver is a banker and when he introduced his family to the president the latter became so enthusiastic at sight of the splendid children that he called for three cheers for the family. Last October Mr. Oliver put \$15,000 in his pocket, came to New York with Mrs. Oliver and their eight children and engaged passage for Europe. The family will spend two years abroad. They will visit the pope, and everywhere they go they have been pointed out as the ideal American family—from the standpoint of the man considered the most capable judge of character in the world. In this family, and when they and their brothers stand in a row they make one of the nicest "step-ladders" imaginable. Another splendid western family is that of Dr. and Mrs. McCann of South Omaha, Neb. Dr. McCann's little flock consists of fourteen—eight of them boys and six girls. The girls are all prize beauties, and the boys are as bright looking youngsters as can be found in the east or west. Some of the girls are exceptionally pretty, and the parents, it is needless to add, are full of the Kenneths. Their eight youngsters are noticed, and it is safe to say that for them to go away from home is to deny to themselves all the attention that they care to experience.

Mrs. Thomas Mulvey of New York City not long ago, with only five children, had a very unpleasant experience. One day, away from Brooklyn alone she was turned away from no less than eighty-seven apartment houses. The agents or the janitors simply looked at her small brood and for some reason did not approve of them and refused to rent a home to the mother. Other large families on American soil are very numerous, and scarcely a day passes that a new record is not discovered for some community. In Washington one of the most attractive families, when there on a visit, is that of Tamara Carroll, vice president of Mexico. Vice President Carroll has eight youngsters, two of them boys and not only the girls are beautiful—all are attractive. George Gould has six splendid specimens. His eldest daughter particularly is strikingly beautiful, while her brothers and sisters are as attractive in appearance and of exceptional brightness of mind.

Mrs. J. E. E. Tarr of Bluffton, Me., has an attractive family of eight-four boys and four girls. They are all splendid young Americans and their mother is exceedingly proud of them. In Casper, Wyo., the Connors family has twenty-eight children. The mother of this exceptionally beautiful brood, and when they are decked in their gowns, they form a group that it would be hard to equal. Kentucky's champion family is that of the Vanderhoofs. They are twenty-eight altogether—twenty-six of them children. They are all healthy and very happy and the Blue Grass state is very proud of the anti-race suicide feeling shown by Papa and Mamma Vanderhoop. Brooklyn, the family city, some little time ago carried off by a party of twenty-two children in the Herrman family. The little flock has been brought on record as a challenge to the borough across the river. The defiance was not taken up and the indications are that the Herrman family will hold the palm for a long time. At any rate, it was unbeaten at last accounts. John Rogers is the prize papa of New Haven. He has twenty at his fireside and all his children are bright and happy. They are proud of their father and of course he is very much delighted with them. Twenty children have come to head Mr. and Mrs. Charles Leston of Nebraska. They live on a farm and the wild prairie and the splendid open air have made the little Lestons vigorous and healthy. They are all enthusiastic friends of Bryan, who he devoted to the record family of the state.

Another Connecticut family of small pretensions is that of Mr. and Mrs. Chapman, very well known throughout the state. There are eighteen little ones in the family and the group on holidays and other days is one of the most attractive it is possible to imagine. In Illinois Joseph Smith is the champion papa. There are twenty little Smiths in his family and they are all alive and exceedingly happy and healthy. Their parents are devoted to them and their pleasures, and as the family is well-to-do the Smith home is one of the most perfect in all respects that can be imagined.

Not only in America, however, are there many large families. James Hindmarsh of New Zealand has fourteen little ones. Only two of them are boys, and as Mr. Hindmarsh is exceedingly desirous of increasing his supply of boys it is expected that he will have a big record when the final count is taken of his antediluvian "brood."
