Windy City Obtains Almost Complete Control of Traction Situation.

DECISION OF FEDERAL SUPREME COURT Act of 1895 Extending Charter Ninety Years in Valid DOES NOT APPLY TO FRANCHISES GRANTED UNDER ACT OF 1887 BY THEIR OWN LIMITS CONTRACT CHARTER RIGHT NOT CONCLUSIVE

RESCUE WORK IS SUSPENDED

Fear of Further Explosions and Gas Causes French Mine Officials to Rest.

PARIS, March 12.—All rescue work has been suspended at the Courrières pits, in which over 1,500 miners last their lives Saturday, owing to the danger of gas and the stretch from decomposing bodies. The engineers fear another explosion and ordered up the relief gangs at 11 o'clock this morning. The engineers will attempt to ventilate the chambers before attempting further rescue. If the results are satisfactory work will be resumed tonight, but it is probable no further efforts will be made until Thursday, as Tuesday will be devoted to funerals.

WASHINGTON, March 12.—In an opinion by Justice McKenna, the supreme court of the United States, today decided the case against the witnesses in the "Paper Trust cases" against them, holding that they should answer the questions propounded to them in the proceedings against the alleged trust, brought by the government. The cases originated in Minnesota and Wisconsin. The Wisconsin cases were dismissed for want of jurisdiction, while in the Minnesota cases the verdict of the court for the district of Minnesota was affirmed.
