Speculation Restrained by Active and Higher Call Money Market. Attempt to Force Prices Upward Fails.

NEW YORK, March 29.—Speculation in the stock market today was under the restraint of the active call money market.

During the early part of the day efforts were made to extend the advance and raise the effect of the higher call money rate.

There was a considerable accumulation of stocks at some points and prices were bid up with some aggressiveness.

When it was seen that the money rate was to go higher, the efforts to get prices up were stopped by a withdrawal of anything like urgent selling induced by the rise in money.
