While it is very true that we need postal savings banks, and should have them, it is well to remember that we have a valuable form of thrift teaching in the school savings banks system in a number of our public schools, and that this system, whereby the children's pennies are regularly col-lected by the teachers in the public schools and placed to the scholars' credit in banks. forces extant in training the young to thrift, business methods, happy self-de-pendence, good habits and good citizenship. It is in some schools in twenty-eight of our states and our school children have saved over \$2,000,000. Often older people open bank accounts, induced to do so through their children having this opofficers of the Delaware county savings fund tell me that perhaps 20 per cent of the parents of the scholars who had not selves opened accounts, to which they add banks they need not have walted for "a little child to lead them," but would likely have been depositors of savings from their

1888, deposited to their credit \$190,682.60. A few figures of the children's savings in public schools elsewhere may be of genin Atlantic City, N. J., have their indi-vidual bank books and their deposits average \$6,000 a year. The scholars of the Norristown public schools have saved year, December, \$691.81. The scholars of Pottstown have saved \$108.300; those of West Chester, \$34.000, those of Chester ford, Spring City, Conshohocken, Oxford, Coatesville, Cheltenham and many other near points are doing proportionately well with the thrift teaching. The system was taken up in the public schools of Pittaburg in 1894, and the scholars there have depasited over \$180,000, while in 1903 and 1904 the thrift teaching was adopted in Carnegie, West Liberty, Rankin, Shoridan and other places near Pittsburg. I simply cite these facts and figures as proof of how willing people are to save small amounts of money, that are otherwise frittered away, when opportunity is granted them.-Philadelphia Ledger.
