NEW LAW FOR THE CHINESE

Michigan Congressman Introduces Bill to Revise the Exclusion Laws. GRANTS FULL WRIT OF HABEAS CORPUS Under Proposed Regulation Burden of Proof Will Be on United States in Suit to Deport Chinese.

WASHINGTON, April 11.—Representative Denby (Mich.) introduced a bill today making extensive revision of the Chinese exclusion act. It extends the operation of this act ten years and incorporates the recommendations of Commissioner General Sargent for American immigrants in China under the supervision of the immigration service and the re-registration of Chinese now in this country.

It repeals the provision of existing law placing the burden of proof upon Chinese arrested for being unlawfully in the United States to show his right to be here. It repeals specifically the provision in the law of 1892, already held unconstitutional, that Chinese found unlawfully in the United States should be imprisoned at hard labor for one year and then deported.

It enlarges the exempt classes beyond those mentioned in the treaty of 1880 to include accountants, bookkeepers, bankers, members of the learned professions, editors or members of other bodies of learning within the category of laborers from entering the United States.

PRODUCTION OF PIG-IRON

Output for March Nearly Five Per Cent Greater Than Best Previous Month. NEW YORK, April 11.—The Iron Age will say tonight: The monthly pig-iron statistics show that March has been a record breaker.

The cast iron pipe interests, which had the best month in their history, during March, have been particularly active. They have taken from 40,000 to 50,000 tons of pig iron, the greater part in the east and in the central west have come in for a share.

The steel corporation bought 11,000 tons of Bessemer iron for shipment to Cleveland and Chicago and also a 2,000 ton lot of basic pig. The Cambria company took 10,000 tons and another interest is in the market for about 20,000 tons.

Private Contractors Win
