FIRST TRADE EXCURSION

Initial Tour for Commercial Interests This Season Starts May 24.

TRAIN WILL INVADE KANSAS TERRITORY

Three Days Will Be Devoted to This Journey, Which is to Be an Elaborate Affair.

Arrangements for the first trade excursion of the Commercial club this summer have been completed by the trade extension committee and the schedule of the trip has been announced. Two days of the excursion will be the Kansas territory of the Rock Island road, a section which has been neglected to a certain extent by the Omaha jobbers, and it is expected a large number of them will make the trip in an effort to line up new business. Accommodations will be better this time than for any trip of last year, for the club will stock its own dining car, and Steward Pryor will be present to see that plenty of everything is served in the best way. The excursion special will be signed for the excursions of the whole season before the first trip is undertaken. It will lessen the labor of the trade extension committee and give it assurance that the last trip, which the jobbers are inclined to slight, will be as successful as the others. The excursion special will leave Omaha at 7 o'clock on the morning of Thursday, May 24, and will arrive on the return at about 10 o'clock Saturday night. The first day the run will be made from Omaha to Manhattan, Kan., and that night the train will go to Goodland, in the western part of Kansas, ready to start early in the morning on the second day's run, which will be from Goodland to Phillipsburg. The third day the trip from Phillipsburg to Omaha will be made.

ORDERS FOR PAVING WORK

City is Anxious for Contractors to Finish the Work Bargained For Months Ago.

Orders have been issued to the paving and curbing contractors having city jobs left over from last year to get busy at once and finish up. Thirteen paving contracts went over. Five belong to the Barber company, five to C. E. Fanning and three to Hugh Murphy. Four curbing contracts unfinished are in the hands of the Commercial Land company and five belong to E. D. Van Court. The curbers were instructed to proceed at once and the paving concerns as rapidly as possible after the curbing is in position.

The paving contracts included in the orders are: Intersection at Eighteenth and Lake streets, Jackson from Ninth to Tenth, California from Twenty-sixth to Central boulevard, Miami from Twenty-second to Twenty-fourth, Eighteenth from Spence to Emmet, Dewey avenue from Twenty-eighth to Twenty-ninth, Davenport from Fortieth to Forty-third, Davenport from Central boulevard to Thirty-first, Twenty-seventh from Farm to Dodge, Thirtieth from Leavenworth to Jackson, California from Twenty-third to Twenty-sixth, Nineteenth from Leavenworth to St. Mary's avenue, Tenth from Castellar to Lincoln boulevard.
