# MUSIC AT OMAHA CHURCHES Types of Modern Dwellings Now Being Erected for Omaha Tenants TIMELY REAL ESTATE TALK

How the Glad Easter Festival Will Be Gelebrated Locally.

ELABORATE PROGRAMS ARE ARRANGED Many Choirs Will Sing the Joyous

Anthems of the Resurrection and Join in Praise of the Risen Christ.

The Feast of the Resurrection will be most solemnly celebrated at St. Philomena's cathedral. In accordance with the gospel account that our Savior arose from the dead "early in the morning before the sun was risen," the services will commence at 5 a. m., with the celebration of a solemn pontificial mass, sung by the Rt. Rev. Bishop Scannell. The Very Rev. William Kelly will act an assistant priest at the throne. The bishop will be assisted by the Rev. M. Leursman, S. J., and the Rev. William Kearns as deacons of honor. The Rev. Bernard Sinne and the Rev. I. Hamill. S. J., will act as deacon and subdeacon of the cases. The Rev. James W. Stenson will act as master of coromonies. The sermon at the mass will be preached by the Right Rev. Bishop, who will impart the papal blessing at the conclusion of the mass. The music at this mass will be rendered by the Junior choir. Low masses will be celebrated at 7, 7:30 and 9. At 10:30 o'clock a solemn high mass will be sung by the Rev. William Kearns, who will be attended by the Right Rev. Monsignor Colaneri, V. G., as deacon, and the Rev. William Mc-Namara as subdeacon. The Rev. James Stenson will preach the sermon at this mass and will also act as master of ceremonies. The entire Senior choir, under the direction of Miss Swift, cathedral organist, will render the sacred music at this ceremony.

The Feast of the Resurrection will be celebrated with due solemnity at St. Ce-cellas' church, Fortleth and Burt streets. Masses will be at 7, 9 and 10:30 o'clock. Omaha Dealers Find Business Keeps Up Remarkably Well.

MANY TRANSACTIONS ARE REPORTED

Negotiations Closed on Several Really Important Transactions, with a Fine Prospect for Continued Activity,

Another active week has passed in real estate, with numerous small and moderate-sized sales, and no very large ones. Little talk is heard of prospective large sales, but what is more satisfactory the agents have many small deals "on" all the time. Commissions are smaller on these, but in the aggregate they are far more satisfactory than a few bigger ones,
