Supreme Court Denies New Trial of Inheritance Tax and Writ.

MUST APPOINT APPRAISERS Estates Will Be Valued and Taxed and

Dengias County Will Get Thousands of Dollars for Improvements.

County Attorney Slabaugh received notice from Lincoln Thursday that the supreme court had denied the motion for a new trial in the inheritance tax case which was appealed from this county. The case was an application for a mandamus o compel former County Judge Vinsonhaler to appoint appraisers in an estate taxable under the law. Judge Vinsonhaler held the law invalid. The case was taken to the supreme court and the law held A motion for a rehearing was filed and has just been overruled.

County Judge Lealie will proceed at once to appoint appraisers in about thirty estates which are subject to taxation and the revenue resulting from the tax will amount to several thousands of dollars. Under the law, this money is to be expended in the building of county roads. A penalty of 7 per cent is provided in case the tax is not paid within six months after the will is probated. Among the larger estates which will be subject to inheritance tax are those of John J. Dickey, Anna M. Goodrich, Samuel Reichenberg, J. L. Brandels, Peter Glandt, Addison S. Carter, Clinton Orcutt, Edward W. Nash, Prederick A. Nash. 2d; John H. Evans, Howard Kennedy, Frank Murphy, Michael Murphy, Ben B. Wood, William W. Marsh, J. J. Brown and J. I. Redick. The appraisers have practically all of the powers of a court in securing evidence on the

value of estates. The law provides a tax of 1 per cent in estates over \$10,000 which descend to lineal descendants, 1 per cent in estates over \$2,000 which descend to other than lineal heirs and 12 per cent on legacies to charity of

WATTLES HAS NOT WITHDRAWN

Has Never Stepped Out Because Never Stepped in the Senatorial Race.

Gurdon W. Wattles returned Thursday morning from Los Angeles, Cal., where he has spent the last three weeks visiting his father, who is 86 years old and in poor health. Mrs. Wattles accompanied him home. He did not intend to make his stay anywhere near so long in Los Angeles but was delayed by the washing out of seventy-five miles of track on the San Pedre line in Nevada. Traffic was interrupted from March 23 to April 16. Mr. Wattles was unable to obtain sleeping car accommodations over other lines and remained until the San Pedro line was in working order again,

The proposition said by many to be most in favor among the members of the board is to combine, with the co-operation of the Commercial club, the transportation affairs of the club and the exchange, securing Commissioner E. J. McVann of the club to act as traffic commissioner for the two bodies. But here again the active members of the exchange have passed opposing resolutions, which will be submitted to the board

at Friday's meeting. Outside of Mr. McVann and the railroad men, there are, however, others from which a selection may be made.

Mr. Wattles has read the Omaha papers each day during his absence and has had correspondence with the grain men, so that he has the situation well in hand. He thinks it probable, but not certain, that the question of the secretaryship will be settled Friday.
