ment Land in Nebranks.

The federal grand jury was engaged in hearing testimony in the Edmonson case from Lincoln on Wednesday. The case is one wherein it is alleged that some public land procured by fraudulent affidavits was traded for other valuable property at Lincoln or in that vicinity. The case is said to possess some sensational features and may result in an indictment for forgery as well as perjuly.

BIG BEEF ORDER FOR ARMY

Half Million Pounds of Dressed Ment from Omaha for Soldiers.

Cantain T. B. Hacker, chief commissary Department of the Missouri, is busy tabulating the bids for the fresh beef and mutton supplies for the posts of the department for six months, beginning July 1 1906. The bids were opened May 18 and called for practically 1,500,000 pounds of dressed fresh beef.
