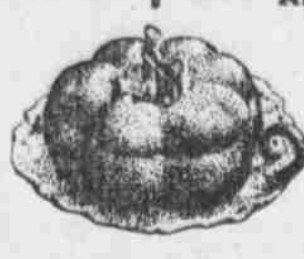

CHOOSE HUSBAND BY BALLOT

Special Election Settles Claim of Rivals for Head of a Kentucky Girl. A special election held for the purpose of determining which of two young Kentucky lovers was entitled to the hand of a Kentucky girl, called the "men folks" of the surrounding country to Maloneon one day recently. The successful man and his bride left for the coast to spend their honeymoon with Old Virginia relatives of the bride. The men were rivals not only for a girl, but for their party's nomination for sheriff of Greenup county as well. The contestants, Tom Witherow and Fred Warnock, agreed to leave the award of both prizes

to the people of the township wherein both had been reared. They held a special election to settle the question. The best man was to take both bride and a clear field for the nomination.
