

PLAN TO REDISTRIBUTE COUNTY

Proposition Submitted to the Board by Commissioner Bruning. ALL PAY ROLLS MUST BE SWORN TO

When Submitted They Shall Be Accompanied by Sworn Statement—Report of Detention Home's First Year.

A plan for the redistricting of the county into commissioner districts was presented at the meeting of the county board Monday morning.

First District—Fourth, seventh, eighth and eleventh wards of the city of Omaha, as the boundaries of said wards are established at the date hereof.

Second District—First, Second, Third and Tenth wards of the city of Omaha, as the boundaries of said wards are established at the date hereof.

Third District—Benning, Chicago, Douglas, Dundee, Ekiorth, Jefferson, McArde, Millard, Union, Platte Valley, Waterloo and Pleasant precincts, as their boundaries are established at the date hereof.

Fourth District—City of South Omaha and Clinton precincts, as their boundaries are established at the date hereof.

Fifth District—Fifth, Sixth, Ninth and Twelfth wards of the city of Omaha and East Omaha precinct, as the boundaries of said wards and said precinct are established at the date hereof.

Detention Home's First Year. Mrs. Harriet H. Heller, superintendent of the detention home, submitted a communication covering in a general way the work of the first year at the home and making suggestions as to improvements needed.

Pay Rolls Must Be Sworn To. The board voted to require all county officials to attach a sworn statement to pay rolls submitted to the board, certifying that the services paid for have actually been performed and noting all vacations allowed employees.

Electric Light Troubles. Poor Coal Accountable for the Dim Illumination of Lamps Last Few Nights.

Owing to inability to procure proper grades of coal the service of the Omaha Electric Light and Power company, which not only supplies Omaha but Council Bluffs and South Omaha, was much deteriorated from Saturday until Monday forenoon.

During the last three weeks there has been a shortage of steam coal in Omaha due to strikes and expected strikes at the soft coal mines.

Appraisals Displease Both Valuations of Property Unsatisfactory to Electric Road Projectors and Residents.

The appraisal recently made in the condemnation proceedings for the Omaha, Lincoln & Beatrice railway are proving unsatisfactory to both sides and appeals to the district court have been taken by the railroad and some of the property owners.

The railroad has completed arrangements to appeal from the appraisal of the property of George Warren Smith, lying south of Omaha.

It is understood the Raths also will take an appeal, claiming irregularities in making the valuation.

Pratt, \$2,000 frame dwelling at Twenty-eighth and Parker; E. H. Germond, \$2,300 frame dwelling at Twenty-seventh and Fowler avenue; Theodore Frederick, \$2,000 frame dwelling at Eleventh and William; May C. Chadwick, \$2,000 frame dwelling at 205 Willis avenue; Jacob Dohall, \$1,100 frame dwelling at 1210 Siasine.
