Corn Strong at Prices Slightly Higher, but Trade is Light-Weather More Favorable Every-where-Data Lower.

OMAHA, June 21, 1906. The opening was uneventful on what but the market turned weak early and lost 1/2 cent, due principally to scarcity of Argentina, Brazil, and unresponsive American strength.

Primary wheat receipts were 311,000 bushels, and shipments 200,000 bushels, against receipts last year of 241,000 bushels and shipments 167,000 bushels.

Prices Are Generally Lower on Precipitate Selling by Speculators.

SLIGHT RALLY IN LAST HOUR

Covering by Shorts Causes Some Improvement, but Close is Easy, with Values at a Fraction Below Lowest.

NEW YORK, June 21.—A pronounced deterioration in the stock market today, the result of a precipitate selling which had a very discouraging and depressing effect on speculative sentiment.

The cause for the precipitate selling was not always easily discoverable and there was nothing on the surface to indicate that the market was about to be abruptly transitioned from the confidence manifested in yesterday's closing to the gloom which characterized today's market.

Some of the symptoms of the week which are regarded as most important from a financial standpoint are regarded as calculated to be of special benefit in Pennsylvania in its stock market standing and in the United States Steel stock and the synthetic effect of this upon the market was very noticeable.
