NEW POINT IN BASE BALL LAW

Catchers Phelps Awarded to Boston Americans. CINCINNATI, June 27.—Ed J. Phelps, catcher, now playing with the Pittsburgh National League club, has been awarded to the Boston American league team, according to a voluminous correspondence received today by Chairman Herndon of the national base ball association. Phelps is said to be the first of his kind to come before the commission. The Cincinnati club, which disposed of Phelps to Boston for \$150,000, will be required to pay the player \$750, his half of the purchase money. Phelps had been given notice by the Cincinnati management of his prospective release, but that club reserved the right to dispose of him to the Boston American league club if all national league clubs waived claim to him and provided Phelps received purchase money.
