The race, which is run over the Seaside course of the Brighton Beach Racing association, has a guaranteed cash value of \$20,000, of which the winner takes \$10,000, the second horse \$5,000 and the third \$2,000. It was in the Brighton handicap two years ago that Bromgick set a new world's record for the mile and a quarter distance.
