Complete Primary Vote is Canvassed and Board Adjourns sine die

ROSEWATER'S MAJORITY OVER TWO TO ONE

Larger Than Originally Showed on the Face-Hitchcock and Dahlman Split About Even

The canvassing board that has been going over the returns from the late primary after ten days' work adjourned sine die yesterday afternoon shortly after 4 o'clock.

The first returns canvassed were those on the democratic congressional delegates, over which there has been considerable rivalry between the Dahlman and anti-Dahlman or Hitchcock factions of the party.
