CHICAGO, July 21.—The estimate of a crop expert giving 400,000,000 bushels as the amount of this year's wheat crop which will be available for export from the United States and Canada resulted in extreme weakness today, the closing quotations on the September delivery being off ic. A fair demand by commission houses, based upon a steady market at Liverpool, caused some firmness immediately after the opening, but the situation was ignored when the estimate of the Minneapolis crop axpert became generally known. Fit traders and local longs sold freely and there was much selling of wheat by commission houses on stop-loss orders. The market was also affected by liberal receipts here and at other primary points. Local receipts for Monday were estimated at 802 cars, which was considered a very liberal supply and this caused additional weakness late in the day. Shorts were the chief buyers. The market closed very weak with prices almost at the lowest point. September opened %c to %c higher at 77%c to 78c. sold up to 78478%c and then declined to 784c. Final quotations were at 76%c. Clearances of wheat and flour were equal to 121,800 bushels against 1,949,000 bushels for the corresponding time last yet. Minneapolis, Duluth and Chicago reported receipts of 614 cars against 524 last week and 214 a year ago.

The corn market was steady for a few minutes early in the day, but the sharp break in wheat, excellent weather and increased country offerings caused a considerable decline.
