Wheat Takes Spurt, but Falls to Saturday's Close.

EXPORTERS NOT ANXIOUS TO BUY YET

They Take but Little on Basis of Present Prices—Cash Corn is Stronger and Movement Doesn't Increase—Options Higher.

CHICAGO, July 23, 1906. Wheat closed unchanged at 87 in London. Iron was higher in the English market with standard American quoted at 2 1/2 and covered warrants at 50c. Locally the market was unchanged. Foundry southern iron, \$23.00; No. 1 foundry southern, \$22.00; No. 2 foundry southern, \$21.00.

Early Market is Shaken by Developments in Russia Over Sunday.

UPTURN IN VALUES SOON FOLLOWS

Owing to Profit Taking in the Last Hour Net Changes Are Small and Close is Easy.

NEW YORK, July 23.—The stock market was tonight shaken by the developments in Russia over Sunday, in common with the world's other securities markets. But resistance was shown by the New York market and the effects had apparently passed the course of half an hour, by which time the confident absorption of stocks had restored the level of prices to where they stood at the close of the day.
