New Police Proclamation.

The prefect of police has issued another proclamation warning the population that persons guilty of armed resistance to the authorities or police, or of attempts to commit political crimes, will be given over to the tender mercies of military courts-martial, while lesser offenses, like participation in the formation of leagues, incitement to strikes, etc., will be punished administratively without trial by a fine of \$1.50 and imprisonment of from three to six months.

The reports from the provinces indicate that the authorities do not fear to employ harsher measures than used at the capital. The editors of controlled newspapers are compelled to give hostages to fortune against attempts at illegal publications. In the meantime the government in spite of the rebuffs received from M. Shipoff and others, whom it appeared has not abandoned the idea of inducing men of standing in the country, outside of bureaucratic circles to enter a reorganized or enlarged cabinet or of creating an advisory council.

The emperor in this connection has renewed the pressure brought to bear upon M. Guchkoff, the prominent moderate member of the Moscow zemstvo.
