NEGRO ASSAULTS A WOMAN

Husband Responds to Call for Help, but the Assailant Escapes.

POLICE ON THE TRAIL OF THE MISCREANT

William Jackson, Missing from His Home and Not Found in Woman's Room Identified as His.

An unknown negro entered the residence of Sister Robinson, at sixteenth street and Sixteenth avenue, shortly after 2 o'clock Sunday morning, and attempted to sexually assault Mrs. Robinson. Mrs. Robinson, who occupied a room with one of her children, was asleep when the negro entered by the window.

Not wishing the notoriety arising from such an affair Robinson failed to notify the police until yesterday morning, but the police had already been on the trail of a negro supposed to have been the one who attempted to assault Mrs. Robinson.

Handy afternoon word was sent to police headquarters that a negro, coatless and hatless, with the sleeve missing from his shirt and his head banded with a handkerchief, was skulking in the woods near Hazel street. Officers went to the place but were unable to locate the negro. Later in the day the negro was heard of in the vicinity of the old paper mills.

Shortly after Robinson had notified the police yesterday morning word was received from the postmaster at Council Bluffs that a telephone had been used by a man with a handkerchief, had passed through a few minutes before and was thought to be hiding in the woods on the outskirts of the town. The postmaster thought it possible that the man might be wanted in Council Bluffs. He was told that the negro was wanted badly. Detective Hough and a posse started after the fellow, but he evidently lost sight of him.

The negro who attempted to assault Mrs. Robinson lost his bat in the struggle with Robinson and also one sleeve of his shirt. Both are now in possession of the police. Investigation by the police has revealed the fact that William Jackson, a negro who worked for Contractor Wickham, had suddenly disappeared. Persons who were acquainted with Jackson identified the man as one he had been wearing.

Charles Hart with Swindling.

C. E. Hart, alias Clark, charged with being a short change artist, will have a hearing in police court this morning. Emil Leffer, the jeweler, who was lured out of his by Clark, on the short change game has filed an information against him charging him with swindling. Clark, or Hart, purchased a collar button for twenty-five cents and gave the young woman clerk in the jewelry store a bill, then discovered he had a quarter and receiving back his \$20 bill, the young woman clerk discovered later that she was short the change she had given the fellow.

Frame Warehouse Burned.

The big frame shed at the corner of Tenth avenue and Ninth street, formerly occupied by the Republic Oil company as a storage warehouse, for oil was destroyed by fire shortly after 3 o'clock last evening. The building, saturated as it was with oil, made a blaze of considerable dimensions. The cause of the fire is unknown, but it is supposed to have started from a spark from a locomotive, the structure being through the Great Western and Union Pacific tracks. The Standard Oil company is said to have owned the building.
