**CHARLES A. TOWNE IN CITY**

**Tammany Congressman with Varied Career Declines to Discuss Heart.**

**OTHER POLITICS IN HOTEL CORRIDORS**

**H. E. Windham Thinks Pollard Has It and Edgar Howard Says Platte County is Not for Berge.**

Congressman Charles A. Towne of New York, candidate for vice president on the Bryan ticket in 1900, was an Omaha visitor for a short while Tuesday morning, taking breakfast at the Paxton hotel. Mr. Towne left at 9:30 o'clock for Glenwood, Ia., where he spoke Tuesday afternoon. Mr. Towne declined to be interviewed on politics. He is a Tammany man and he refused to say what Tammany would do in the Heart's gubernatorial campaign.

Charles A. Towne has had a varied career in politics. He first came into prominence as a Minnesota congressman from the Duluth district, which the inimitable J. Adam Bede now represents, March being his old home. He was a republican then and remained such until the campaign of 1886, when he, with John Lind and other Minnesota republicans, switched over, first calling themselves silver republicans, finding no permanent shelter as "silver republicans" they became democrats. And Towne last his seat in congress. He ran for it as a democrat, but Page Morris, now federal judge in Duluth, beat him. Towne's friends declared he had committed political suicide and he is said to have formed a high opinion later of their judgment. He was the acknowledged leader for the next vacancy in the United States senate until he changed his politics and here is where one of those strange freaks of political affairs comes in.

He committed political suicide; he forfeited all that fortune permanently held for him in the North Star state and yet he was the next man sent from Minnesota to the United States senate. He succeeded Chushman K. Davis in the winter of 1901, but his term was of brief duration. He died in November, 1900. John Lind, democrat, was governor until January 3, 1901, when he was succeeded by Samuel R. Van Sant, who had been elected in November. When the legislature convened, January 3, it became Lind's duty, or at least right, to name a successor to Davis. Lind, though at that time not on the friendliest personal terms with Quindt's silver-tongued orator, bowed to the will of his party and named Towne. Towne served until March 4, when Moses E. Clapp, elected by the republican legislature after an interesting contest, took his seat.

His running for vice president in 1900 is a bit of political history that helped along the crazy-quit record.

Towne then plunged into the oil business at Beaumont, Tex. Then he went to New York, giving the impression he was through with politics and rumors floated out over the country that he had amassed a fortune and was a plutocrat. But it wasn't long till the familiar voice and the familiar name of "Charley Towne" were wafted with their magic charm from one end of the political arena to the other and Tammany put him in congress.

"We think the action of Nebraska county indicates the nomination of Congressman Pollard," said Representative Windham of Cass county, floor leader of the house in the last legislature. "Of course, there is some talk of Lancaster county wavering at the last in its support of him, but his friends scarcely look for a repudiation of its pledge by Lancaster."

"Senator Sheldon, we think has a good chance for the nomination for governor; we think a little better chance than any of the opponents. Personally I believe Sheldon is a strong man and would not only make a difficult man to beat, but a good
