America's Commerce. The foreign commerce of the United States approached the three billion dollar point in the calendar year 1906. The total mports and exports of merchandise for that year, as shown by the Department of Commerce and Labor through its Bureau of Statistics, was 2,806 million dollars, against 2,307 millions in 1909, an average increase of 150 millions a year in the fiveyear period. If to the 3,806 millions of foreign commerce in 1905 were added the figures of trade with Hawaii and Porto Rico, formerly foreign territory and included in our statement of foreign trade prior to 1901, the total would approximate 2,900 million dollars, or about 600 millions more than five years ago, and 1,200 millions more than ten years ago.-Harper's Week-
