RAILROADS NOW OBEY LAW

Mightiest Corporations, Says Greene, Have Begun to Recognize Statutes. Argument Closes in Railroads Suit to Knock Out Ticket Brokers and Court Considers the Case.

"The time has arrived when the railroads and the mightiest corporations have begun to recognize the potency of the United States statutes. When they begin now to talk of ignoring those laws they first inquire as to the health of their ablest attorneys," said Charles J. Greene, attorney for the Burlington railroad, Wednesday morning in the federal court, where the railroads are seeking to have the ticket brokers enjoined from further traffic in their business.

Attorney Frank S. Howell finished his argument in behalf of the ticket brokers at 10:35 Wednesday morning. He was followed by Mr. Greene in behalf of the railroads. Mr. Greene stated that the object of the suit was not for past transactions, but to prevent future transactions on the part of the ticket brokers of the character complained of, simply to buy and sell the unused portions of non-transferable tickets. He denied that the Western Traffic association was an unlawful organization, created in defiance of the Sherman act or the interstate commerce laws.

"The position taken by the opposing counsel is not good morals in the abstract," said Mr. Greene. "They evidently expect to affix the stamp of legality upon their illegal actions by securing a modification of the national law. The Western Traffic association is not an unlawful body, nor is it engaged in unlawful practice. When a ticket is sold a passenger for a distance several roads are participants in the profits of that transaction, and this association is created for the purpose of maintaining lawful rates and the apportioning of the pro-

ceeds of the sale of that ticket to all the roads which have rendered partial service in the transportation of the purchaser." Ben T. White of the Northwestern road concluded the argument for the railroads, after which Judge Carland took the matter under advisement. Just when his decision will be handed down is not known, but will probably be before the close of the week.
