

RAILROADS PLAN FOR RUSH

All Lines Converting in Omaha Prepare for West Freight Traffic. ALL TO BRING ENORMOUS BUSINESS. Estimated that Increase Over Corresponding Period Last Year Will Be Fifteen to Twenty Per Cent.

Railroads centering in Omaha are preparing for a greatly increased freight traffic this fall over anything they have yet had to meet. All the cars are now in the yards moving the grain, because of the reduced rates, but the period of these rates will soon be over and regular business will be resumed.

Roads at Sea on New Rate. Railroad men are at sea still as to what to do to comply with the requirements of the new rate law which goes into effect August 28.

There is nothing in the story that the railroads contemplate raising rates and a leading passenger representative of one of the Omaha roads. On the other hand there seems to be a tendency to reduce the rates and if this is done it may be a step toward uniformity in rates such as cutting out reduced rates to conventions and other gatherings.

Eastern correspondents are saying that inquiry and deduction have made it reasonably clear in Washington that the railroads in asking for this extension of time in which to file schedules are really preparing to go on a new basis of charges which will be higher than anything this country has known.

The Interstate Commerce commission will take no action on the matter until after the law goes into effect August 28, when some cases will be immediately brought before it.

Steel Car Defies Wreck. The first steel passenger car to go through a wreck in this country has come through with colors flying and the steel car is proven to be the only thing. In a wreck on the Erie, near Burbank, O., one of the steel mail cars was derailed and plunged down a twelve-foot embankment.

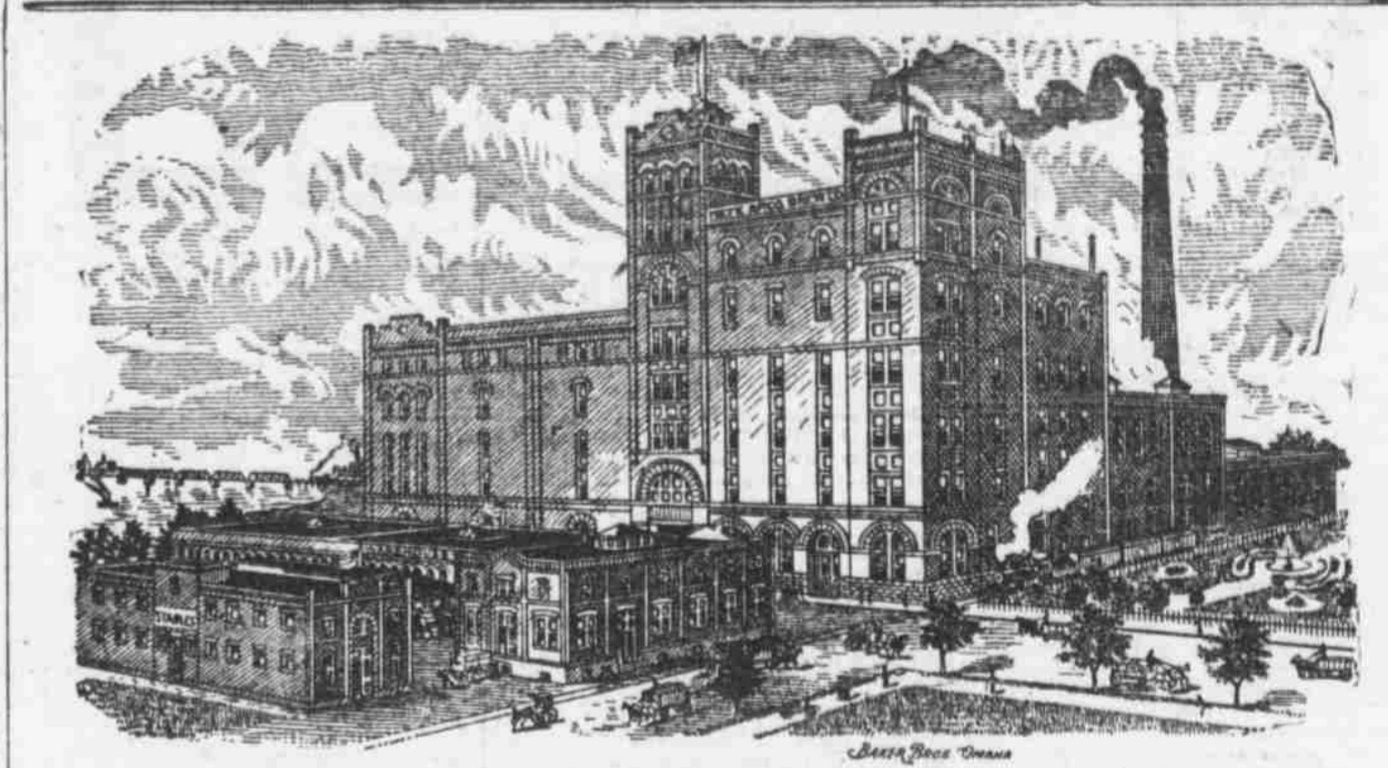
