

MAYOR FORCES CUT IN LEVY

Compels Council to Knock Off Hundred and Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars. TOTAL RATE WILL BE FIFTY-SIX MILLS

Decrease Partially Due to Increased Assessed Valuation, Last Levy Being Sixty-Four and Eight Tenths.

Forced by Mayor Dahlman, the council agreed yesterday to a \$125,000 cut in the proposed \$1,000,000 tax levy for city purposes in 1907.

Councilmen at once undertook to show his honor that the sinking fund might be reduced, but nothing could be saved on municipal expenditures otherwise because the city is growing rapidly and needing more money every year.

The action means about a 56-mill levy for the city, against 64.8 mills in 1904, the decrease being partly accounted for by increased assessment valuation, figured on a one-fifth basis.
