MORE LANGFELD PROPERTY

Articles Stolen from Doctor's Home Are Recovered by South Omaha Police.

Thursday morning the South Omaha chief of police advised the Omaha police department that fourteen pieces of silverware and a clock stolen from the home of Dr. Millard Langfeld have been recovered in South Omaha. Altogether the police have located fifty-six pieces of silverware taken from the Langfeld home, besides other articles of value. Dr. Langfeld arrived home Thursday afternoon and will be called on by the police to identify the stolen articles before charges are filed against Harry Munroe and Harry Cummings, now being held at the city jail on charges of having entered the Langfeld house Sunday evening.

It is believed the prisoners will be arraigned in the police court Friday morning. Dr. Millard Langfeld and family returned Thursday from a trip to Philadelphia and the east.

WATER COMPANY LOSES AGAIN

General Manager and Secretary Held by Higher Court to Be in Contempt.

A mandate has just been received from the United States circuit court of appeals for the Eighth district affirming the judgment of the United States circuit court for the district of Nebraska in the contempt proceedings against Stockton Heath and E. M. Fairfield of the Omaha Water company, wherein they were fined \$50 each for contempt of court in failing to produce the books of the water company in the examination held before Special Examiner C. W. Fearsall. The water company appealed the case to the circuit court of appeals and the judgment just rendered is the result.

Drummy, son of Detective Sam Drummy, is making well at St. Joseph's hospital, where he was taken Tuesday evening after having been injured between Waterloo and Elkhorn while firing on a Union Pacific work train, which collided with a freight train.
