Omaha Heavy Shippers Feel that They Are Hard Hit by New Rules.

RAILROADS SAY NEW LAW IS TO BLAME

Change is General and Not Solely Applied to Omaha and Will Be in Effect Till Changed by Appeal.

The special committee appointed by the heavy shippers of Omaha, is very active in getting together evidence for the case which they say will be brought against the Western Car Service association, which is composed of all the roads doing business in Omaha.

On the Railroad's Side.

As presented by the railroad's side of the controversy H. H. Churchill, general agent of the Chicago Great Western railroad, said:

"The railroads are simply protecting their own interests and trying to minimize the abuse of their equipment, and at the same time to do it lawfully. The new law provides that all rates and charges must be reasonable, and as these charges are made in accordance with the law the shippers will have recourse in the courts if they think the rates are not fair."

Not Snap Judgment. "These rules are no snap judgment, put in effect in Omaha alone, but are now in effect all over the country. The Great Western has incorporated them in its new tariffs, as is required by the new law."

Northwesterns Postpone Tariff. The Northwestern in the first road to post its new tariff in Omaha, in compliance with the provisions of the new law.

TARIFF ON GRAIN IN DOUBT

New Rate from South Dakota May Be Held Up for Thirty Days.

Whether or not the Northwestern and Milwaukee filed their new tariffs on South Dakota grain to Omaha with the Interstate Commerce commission before the new law went into effect, is a question that now concerns the members of the Omaha Grain exchange.

If the tariffs were filed with the commission prior to August 25, the new rates may go into effect on any date set by the traffic officials in the tariff sheets, but if they have not been filed, they cannot go into effect, according to the law, until thirty days have expired after publication.

It is probable, says an Omaha man versed in railroad matters, that the commission will reduce this required period to ten days, since the lake shipping associations of the country have requested it.

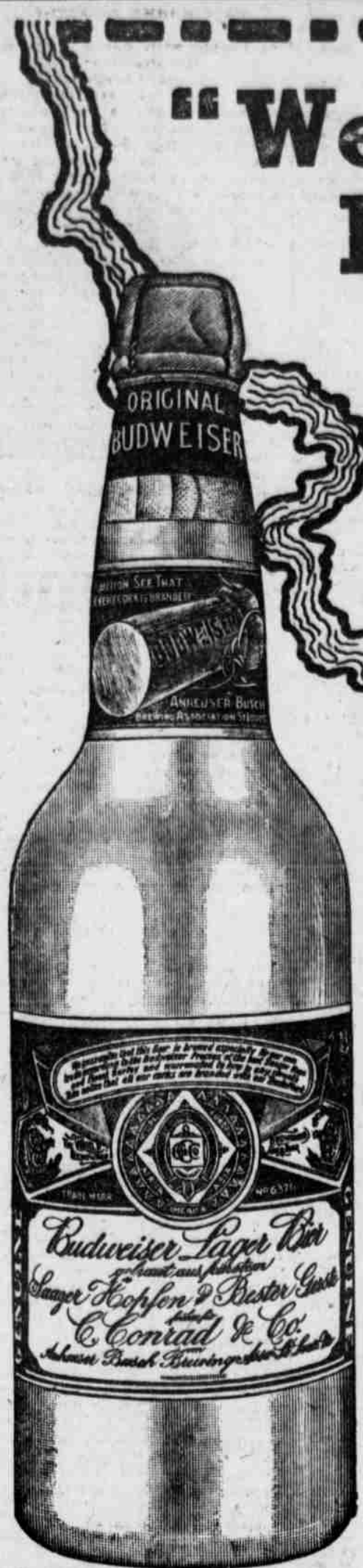
