CANNON TO SPEAK IN BLUFFS

Congressman Watson of Indiana is to Accompany Him.

CUMMINS ALSO BOOKED FOR AN ADDRESS

Effort Will Be Made to Secure Special Rates on All Railroads for Both Events and Attract a Big Crowd.

Unless present plans fall through Speaker Cannon and Congressman Watson of Indiana will speak in Council Bluffs on Thursday, September 27. Elmer E. Smith, chairman of the republican county central committee, has been in communication with Henry Casson of New York, chairman of the republican national congressional committee, and expects to hear from the latter definitely today whether the two noted speakers can come to Council Bluffs on the date named. A week or so ago Chairman Smith was advised by the national congressional committee that Speaker Cannon and Congressman Watson would be in this section of the country, and unless something unforeseen happened they could be secured to speak in Council Bluffs on the afternoon of September 27. Mr. Smith, after consulting with a number of leading republicans, wrote Chairman Casson that the offer would be gladly accepted. Tentative arrangements have been made by Mr. Smith and his committee to secure the New theater for the afternoon of September 27 and every effort will be made to have a big crowd to greet the two distinguished statesmen. The fact that Speaker Cannon is to be one of the speakers, it is believed, will be sufficient to pack the theater from floor to roof. Congressman Watson is said to be a host in himself and one of the foremost political speakers of the day. As soon as definite word is received from Chairman Casson that Speaker Cannon and Congressman Watson will be able to do so, the county central committee will make arrangements to have the meeting widely advertised throughout the Ninth congressional district and undoubtedly there will be a large attendance of leading republicans from outside the city. Cummins Also Wanted. Arrangements are also being made with the state central committee to have Governor Cummins speak in Council Bluffs during the present campaign. Chairman Smith has been in communication with the state committee and he has been given assurance that Governor Cummins will speak in this city. The date has not yet been fixed, but Mr. Smith is anxious to be able to arrange to have Governor Cummins here some day during the first week in October. It is hoped that arrangements can be made for a night meeting and the opera house will be engaged for Mr. Cummins to speak in the event of the committee being unable to hire the opera house the Dodge Light Guards' armory or the large hall in the Masonic temple will be engaged.

TILMAN DISSATISFIED WITH TRADE

Sues I. W. Waynick for Twenty-Five Thousand Damages. The suit of J. W. Tilman against I. W. Waynick has been transferred from the district court of Fremont county to the United States court here for trial at the time which opens Tuesday. The suit arises over the purchase by Tilman of the Sidney, Ia., telephone line and he asks that he be awarded \$25,000 damages against Waynick, alleging that the latter made false representations to him regarding the value of the property. From the papers filed it appears that Tilman traded 1,400 acres of valuable land in Nebraska and considerable personal property to Waynick for the privilege and right to own the City Telephone company, which does business in Fremont and Mills counties. Tilman alleges that Waynick assured him that the telephone property could be "cashed for \$35,000 at any bank in Sidney," whereas experience has shown him (Tilman) that apart from incumbrances \$5,000 would be a big price for the telephone line. Tilman claims further that the stock of the company was never turned over to him and that the telephone line instead of paying 1400 a month, as he alleged Waynick said it would, it had barely paid expenses. The suit was transferred to the federal court here on the application of the defendant, Waynick, who claims his residence to be in Nebraska while that of the plaintiff is in Iowa.
