Wheat Opens Firm and Advances Under Cash Demand.

MAKES CONSIDERABLE GAIN FOR DAY

More Activity Shown Than for Some Time-Corn Does Not Sympathise and Drops to Lower Prices Than Before.

Wheat opened first and advanced under the influence of a better cash demand, closing the above yesterday for December and the above for May.

Trade was better than for some time. Cables were firm, and while the weather was generally favorable, the receipts did not show the increase that was anticipated. Durum comprises a large part of the receipts. Several large sales of wheat and flour for export were reported from the northwest.

Bull advices from Minneapolis say that the quantity and quality of wheat has been deteriorated very materially since the estimates when the crop was first cut. Rain has injured the crops, say reports covering Kansas, Nebraska, South Dakota and Minnessota, and is now playing havoe further north. Grains of all kinds is growing in shocks and stacks and advices are that it is impossible to tell what the outcome will be until after threshing is finished.

CHICAGO, Sept. 7.—Covering by shorts caused strength in the local wheat market today, final quotations on the December delivery being up to. Corn was a shade lower. Oats were 100 cover. Sentiment in the wheat pit was inclined to bullishness all day. At the start the market was influenced by comparative strength of the wheat market at Inverpool, where prices showed moderate gains notwithstanding the slight decline here yesterday. Receipts today at Minneapolis and Duluth were still of small volume and this belief to encourage the bulls. Trading

A good demand for cash wheat also helped to atimulate the buying of options. The market closed strong, December opened unchanged to the higher at 156754c, sold up to 76c and closed at 755c. Clearances of wheat and flour were equal to 352,400 bu. Primary receipts were 1,000,000 bu. compared with 1,300,000 bu. for the corresponding time a year ago. Minneapolis, Duluth and Chicago reported receipts of 65 cars, against 523 cars leat week and 1,634 cars one year ago.

Notwithstanding much smaller receipts than expected the corn market was easy early in the day on selling by pit traders. Later sentiment became somewhat firmer, but trading continued quiet all day. The strength of wheat was a buillish factor later in the session. The close was steady. December opened unchanged to 16c lower at 434,6345c, sold up to 434c and closed at 434,6345c. Local receipts were 290 cars. with 211 of contract grade.
