SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 28.—San Francisco has continued to pass the forty million mark in its clearings, and the last week, ending at noon Thursday, September 27, has shown an increase of 25.33 per cent over the same week of 1905. The clearings for the last week were \$42,960,891.30 and those for the same week of the previous year amounted to \$34,250,510.24, an increase of \$8,710,381.06.

troops at Russell Ready. CHRYEENE, Wyo. Sept. 28.—(Special)—Anticipating a campaign in Cuba, the troops at Fort D. A. Russell are getting in readiness to answer the call. It is certain that in the event of intervention, the Eleventh Infantry, Tenth Cavalry, Nineteenth and Twelfth batteries of field artillery, stationed at Russell, will be called upon. They are among the oldest troops back from the Philippines and would be first to go to Cuba. Fort Russell could send not less than 1,000 men, sixteen guns, 2,000 horses. One of the batteries is now at Pike's Peak, and the other, with the Tenth Cavalry, is at the state fair at Douglas. The Russell troops have put in an entire summer in the field and are in first-class condition for fighting service in Cuba.
