Chicago Report

CHICAGO, Oct. 12.—The annual report of the Chicago, Burlington and Quincy road, just issued, for the fiscal year ended June 30, shows total gross earnings of \$74,662,441, leaving net earnings of \$22,963,025. After the deduction of taxes the net income is \$20,938,129. The total amount to the credit of sinking funds June 30, 1905, was \$24,273,773. This amount was increased during the last fiscal year by \$1,977,300.
