Action Against Former Postmaster on

The suit against Joseph Crow, former postmaster of Omaha, and his sureties on his bond of \$140,000 as postmaster growing out of the defalcation of Albert Olson has been dismissed and Mr. Crow is ahead 62, cents on the transaction.

Olson was a clerk in the stamp department of the Omaha office and was found short \$2,132.12. He was arrested, indicted. confessed and sentenced on January 14, 1904, to pay a fine of \$2,000, which was paid for him by certain friends. The bonding company in which Olson was bonded paid the government \$1,000, the amount of the bond, which left a balance of the whole amount to be paid by Postmaster Crow of \$1,028.97, the remainder having been reimbursed to the government by Olson and Crow at once appealed to congress to be reimbursed the amount of the shortage for which he was still responsible, which was granted by bill No. 1537, dated April 11, 1906, carrying with it an appropriation of \$1,029.59 for that purpose. Of this amount the sum of \$1,028.97 has been turned into the treasury to credit on the shortage and a draft for 62 cents has been sent Mr. Crow for the balance and the suit is ordered dismissed as against him and his
