

JUDGE A. N. FERGUSON DEAD

Flores Lawyer Passes Away After Illness of Two Weeks.

CAME TO OMAHA HALF CENTURY AGO

Son of Fenner Ferguson, Who Was Appointed Chief Justice of Nebraska Territory by President Pierce.

Judge A. N. Ferguson died Friday afternoon at 3 o'clock at his residence, 220 North Eighteenth street, after a sickness of about two weeks.

Arthur Northcott Ferguson was born October 4, 1852, at Albany, N. Y. His father was Fenner Ferguson, who at the time of Judge Ferguson's birth was a practicing attorney at Albany.

In Michigan he attended the district school, and at Bellevue he attended the private school of Mrs. Nye.

He began the practice of law at Bellevue in 1870, remaining there until 1872, when he moved to Omaha, which has been his home ever since.

He was elected to the Nebraska territory to congress from the Nebraska territory, being elected in 1875. Judge Ferguson was a lawyer with a large practice and was universally trusted and respected.

ILLINOIS TAXES FRATERNALS

Supreme Court Decides Modern Woodmen and Others Must Pay on Funds.

Nebraska is not the only state in the union where fraternal beneficiary orders have been required to pay taxes on their funds. The Illinois supreme court has handed down a decision that all such orders must pay taxes on their quarterly funds and all other funds and money of the societies.

The opinion was rendered in the case of the supreme lodge of the Modern American fraternal order against the board of revenue of Effingham county. The supreme lodge scheduled office furniture and supplies for taxation amounting to \$8,000, but the board of revenue added \$30,000, the amount of mortuary and expense fund on hand.

The court holds that the legislature has not the power to exempt from taxation any property which is not exempted by the plain language of the constitution. Under the opinion the board of equalization is required to assess the capital stock of mercantile and manufacturing corporations, companies organized for publishing purposes, etc., and the only exemptions which can possibly be made are property which is used exclusively for agricultural and horticultural societies, school, religious, cemetery and charitable purposes and the property of the state, county and municipal corporations.

A readjustment of rates may be made necessary in some of the orders because of the increase in expenses. This will necessitate, as thousands of dollars formerly exempt will be placed on the assessment rolls.

"Well, that's different. If it is a green tea we can send me half a pound. But no English in mine."

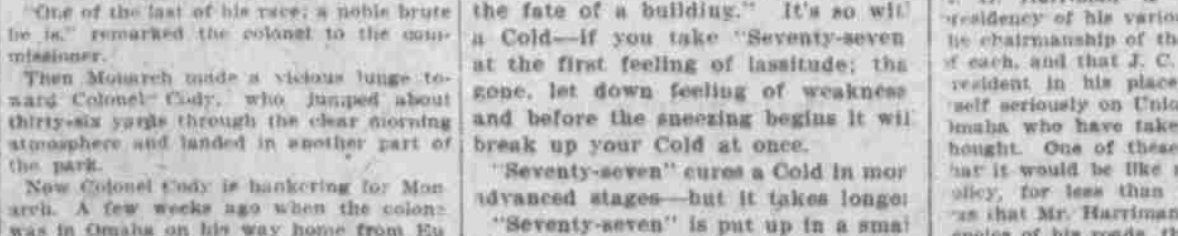
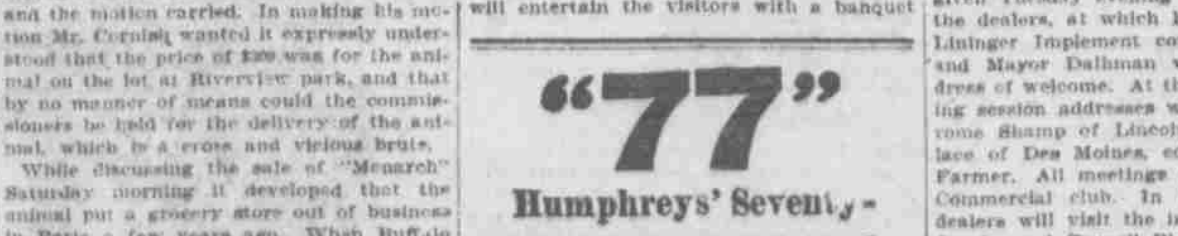
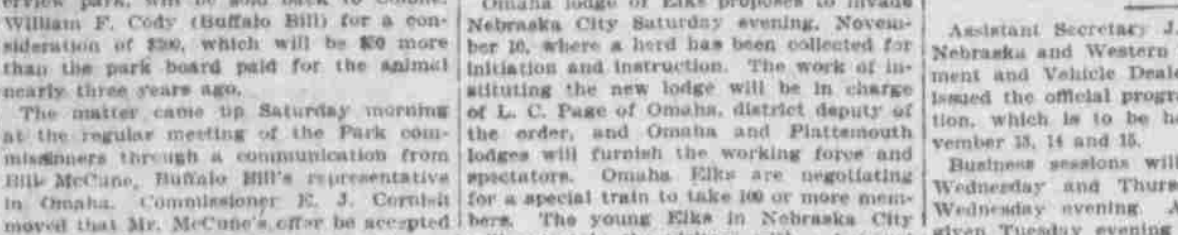
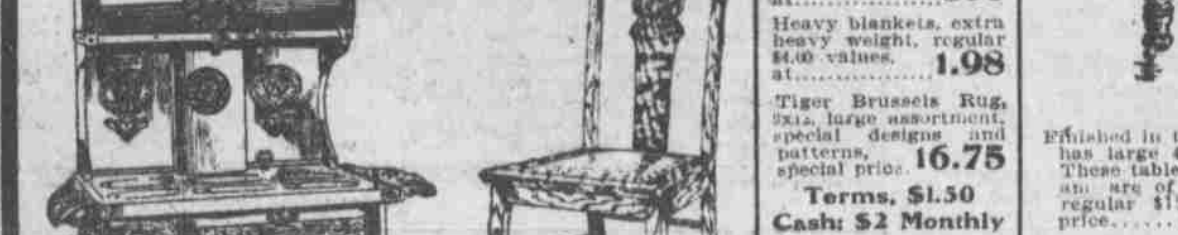
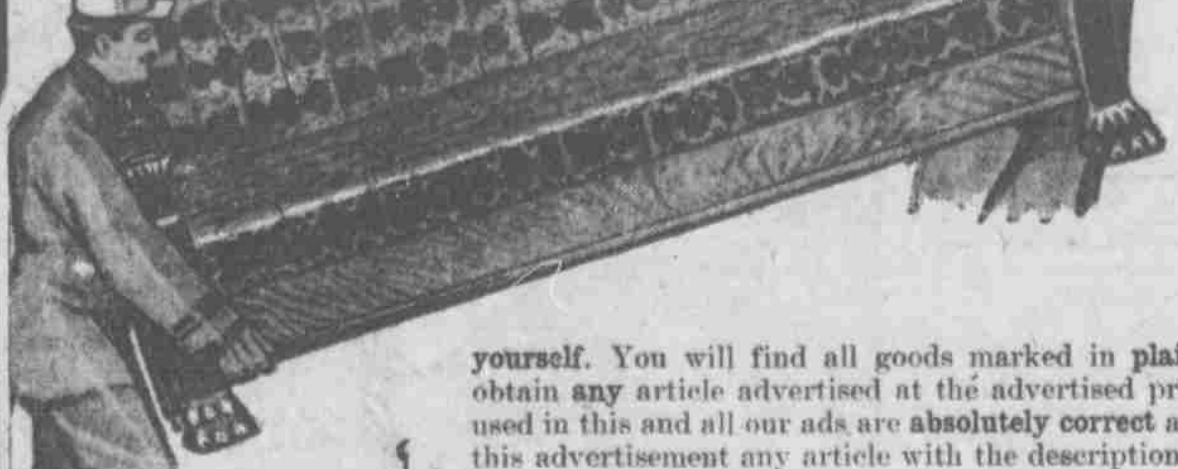
SHOPLIFTER CAUGHT IN ACT
