MIXED UP IN THE STENSLAND FAILURE

Discrepancy of \$5,000 Discovered During Meeting Here, but Treasurer Made It Good and Auditor Passed His Accounts.

The press dispatches announcing the disappearance of Supreme Treasurer Ekliden of the Danish Brotherhood and a possible shortage of \$5,000 in his accounts with the society proved no surprise to the local members of the order. In fact it had been known among the members in this city for several days that a shortage existed in the accounts of the supreme treasurer.

Danish Brotherhood Hit

CHICAGO, Nov. 3.—J. Christian Ekliden of Chicago, (triple) supreme treasurer of the Danish Brotherhood, fraternal, is missing and simultaneously it is found that \$5,000 of the order's funds is gone.

Ekliden has not been seen since October 20.

H. H. Vogt of Davenport, Ia., supreme president and Martin Laxton of Racine, supreme vice president, yesterday concluded an examination of Ekliden's accounts, which reveal they are short.
