PARIS, Nov. 8.—The hearing of the Castellane divorce suit was resumed before Judge Dittie in the Palace of Justice this morning. Maitre Bonnet of counsel for Count Boni de Castellane, contended less than an hour in concluding his argument for the count.

Cruppi Defends Kelly. Maitre Cruppi, for the countess, in reply charged the count's lawyer with seeking to divert attention from the issue at the bar by making an unprecedented and baseless attack on Mr. Kelly, who, counsel declared, enjoyed a standing in the United States as France which made his defense superfluous.

TWELVE-INCH GUN IS WEAK General Crozier Says It Would Destroy Itself in Short Engagement. MUZZLE VELOCITY TOO HIGH FOR LONG LIFE

WASHINGTON, Nov. 8.—The twelve-inch gun now in use at most of the coast fortifications of the United States would not last through an engagement of two hours, the period that would elapse from the time the leading vessel of a fleet would come within the range until the last vessel would pass beyond the range of the guns, is the statement made yesterday by General William Crozier, chief of ordnance, whose annual report was made public at the War department today.

Smaller Calibers Also Weak. Similar statements can be made with regard to guns of smaller calibers, says the report, although as the caliber diminishes the velocity increases.
