Advices as to collections are more uniformly good than at any previous time this season and the early advices point to stocks of goods being well broken, despite fears that prospective high prices may have caused some speculative overbuying.

Industry presents as active an appearance as ever and labor is getting high returns, an example of this being anorded by an advance of is per cent in wages by by an advance of 10 per cent in wages by a number of leading raliways. All in all, the situation is one of immense activity and of eagerness, despite the fact that prices of staples generally show advancing tendencies and index numbers are at the highest point for at least twenty years. Large orders for steel cars are on the market and locomotives are being ordered freely. There is a rather more buoyant tone

There is a rather more buoyant tone in the shoe trade. Retail trade is better, manufacturers selling direct to that branch reporting good reorders.

The position of manufactured textiles was apparently never extronger than it is at present. Cotton goods have been quiet over election, but not so much because of uncertainty as because all goods that can be secured in the next few months have been sold.

Cotton continued the rapid decline of last week and up to Thursday had lost 110 points from the high point in the late rise, though still 45 points above the low point touched late in December. Very large movements and good weather reports were the impelling forces.

Sales of wool are smaller at Boston, but still above the normal. Large transactions of the last three weeks have cleaned up suppiles well and dealers get what they are more readily.
Woolen goods trade reports are more favorable, especially for fine yarn varieties, and some mills are running nights on heavy weight goods.


