

ANDREWS LAUDS ROOSEVELT
Chancellor Says President's Endorsement of New Spelling is Eminent Act.

WANTS REFORM IN ALL SCHOOLS
Would Not Make It Compulsory, but Arbitrary—Addresses Woman's Club and Public School Teachers.

"The stand taken by President Roosevelt on the reformed spelling is the bravest of all his actions," said Chancellor E. Benjamin Andrews to a reporter of The Bee when he arrived yesterday to address the members of the city on spelling reform.

The popular idea of the new spelling is wrong in several particulars, said Dr. Andrews in his interview. "It does not aim to be phonetic entirely, but phonetic with variations. Certain letters which are silent must be left in some words to distinguish them from other words with the same pronunciation but different meaning. Thus, the verb 'to read' is spelled the same in the present and past tense. Some reformers propose to spell the present tense as it is pronounced, 'read.' But why not spell it as it is spelled now with an 'e' instead of putting an 'e' in the place. Then I would spell the past tense of the verb with an 'e'."

Not a Complete List.
The 200 words now adopted contain many that were formerly spelled either of two ways. It is by no means a complete list. People are puzzled and ask why we don't add such and such a word. The reason is that this is an arbitrary list. It is adopted merely to make a start, to get the people to ponder on these things. Hereafter the board may meet every one or two or five years and adopt and publish more words. And so the new spelling will gradually come about. Order will be brought out of chaos.

Chancellor Andrews was the guest while here of Superintendent Davidson of the public schools, and Mr. Davidson and the public school teachers were special guests of the Woman's club at the lecture.

DAHLMAN FAILS TO SIGN
Returns Resolution to Proceed Against Grier Without Adding His Official Signature.

Yesterday afternoon Mayor Dahlman returned without his signature, a concurrent resolution adopted last Tuesday evening by the council and directing that the city proceed to demand from Lee Grier, former clerk of the police court, and the surety on his bonds an amount of \$17,728.33, alleged shortage from May, 1905, to June, 1906. This resolution will come up in regular order at this week's council meeting and it is believed will be acted on regardless of the mayor. Explaining his failure to sign the resolution, Mayor Dahlman said he had all along contended that action should not be taken in the Grier matter on the report rendered by Comptroller Lobbeck and he believed his action regarding the resolution was only being consistent in this matter.
